The Scenic Carpenter with other staff is responsible for construction of all assigned scenery pieces for all shows/events; also load-in, set-up and strike. Under the direction of the Technical Director the Scenic carpenter constructs scenery to drawings and specifications provided. Assist with rigging, scene painting, and props as needed.

- Training in all major carpentry and construction tools
- Excellent communication and problem-solving skills.
- Ability to be proactive, self-motivated, and highly organized in time management, and scheduling.
- Ability to work under time pressure and meet deadlines.
- Understanding of scenic elements, practices, and terminology.
- Knowledge and prior experience using power and hand tools.
- Knowledge of other stagecraft disciplines helpful including rigging, lighting, painting, and fine carpentry.
- Masters, BFA, BA or similar degree in technical theatre.
- Minimum 2-year Experience in a professional theater setting
- Full working knowledge of CAD (preferably Vectorworks)
- Strong computer skills (preferably MAC and google docs)
- Experience with InDesign, Photoshop, Illustrator are helpful.
- Possession of a valid driver's license and your own vehicle.

Physical requirements

- Ability to work long hours and work with a flexible schedule.
- May have to work at heights, around moving machinery with exposure to noise, vibration, and dust.
- Must be willing to travel and work at various work sites in Charleston.

- Ability to work safely in an environment containing potentially hazardous electrical equipment, fumes and/or materials.
- Must be able to perform physical activities such as, but not limited to, lifting, bending, standing, climbing and/or walking and ability to safely lift at least 50 pounds.

Load-in/Strike Duties

- Assist at load-in to the theatre for each production.
- Provide assistance to complete designs and construction onstage.
- Help maintain tools, hardware inventories at the theatre.
- Assist with all strikes.
